linking HIV-positive individuals to health care and life-saving medications



expanding testing for HIV and sexually transmitted infections (STIs)



assisting HIV-negative individuals in getting preand post-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP and PEP), which are highly effective in preventing HIV.

We advocate for increased sexual health awareness and provide public education about HIV and STIs to fight and end the stigma and discrimination many people living with HIV/AIDS continue to experience.

Undetectable = Untransmittable

If a person who has HIV takes medication and has a viral level so low that it cannot be detected in regular blood tests, it means s/he cannot pass HIV on to a sexual partner.

We are proud to be a partner in promoting this message, which is a game-changer that helps educate the public and end HIV stigma.

Becoming an APRI Client

A person must be living with HIV/AIDS, and able to show proof of RI residence and income (below 500% of the federal poverty level). To enroll, please call us at 401.331.1350, ext. 3105 and ask for the Intake Department.

All HIV support services at APRI are funded through Part B of the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program, administered by the Health Resources and Services Administration.



HIV/STI Testing & Free Condoms

We understand that an important part of the fight against HIV and other sexually transmitted infections (STIs) is preventing them. That is why we offer free, anonymous HIV, syphilis, and hepatitis C testing and free condoms at our office in Providence and via our mobile testing van.

In addition, we co-host testing with a number of community partners throughout the state, including every college and university in Rhode Island; United Way's 2-1-1 bus; and many more. APRI refers individuals who would like testing for chlamydia, gonorrhea, and other STIs to health care partners.

PrEP & PEP

We can link HIV-negative individuals to medical providers who prescribe pre- and post-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP and PEP).



PrEP is available as a pill taken once a day. It is up to 99% effective in preventing HIV if taken as prescribed.



PEP is a regimen of medications a person takes for up to 30 days after a possible HIV exposure to prevent infection.
